The year in review

As we reflect on 2024, our journey has been defined by transformation, resilience, and unwavering commitment to our mission.

This year marked a profound evolution for our organization. We changed our name from Poverty Alleviation Chicago to Letters Charity—a change that captures the essence of our work. It's not just about the gifts or the money we deliver, but about the hope experienced when we read a person's letter asking for help and then show up, in person, to answer it.

Our second annual Letters To Santa: The Holiday Gala was hosted by Brookfield Zoo Chicago and was a testament to the power of community. The event sold out, raising an incredible \$164,000.

Organizationally, we navigated significant changes. Heather Whinna transitioned to Chief Mission Officer, while I stepped into the role of Executive Director. This shift allows us to continue our strategic advocacy while maintaining our day-to-day operations.

Most importantly, 2024 was a year of profound loss. On May 7th, we lost Heather's husband, Steve Albini—an impossibly massive loss for all who knew and loved him. Steve, who alongside Heather answered the first letter in 1995, was the heart of our organization. Every Christmas, he wrapped thousands of gifts, drove our delivery van, and passionately advocated for families facing exploitation. His absence is deeply felt and his spirit will continue to guide our work.

As we look forward, we carry with us the lessons, the love, and the legacy of those who have made our work possible. Our commitment remains unchanged: to read letters, to listen, and to answer.
